#### Simile

A comparison of two different things using the words, "like" or "as".

Example:

On her first day of school, Jane was <u>as cool as a cucumber</u>.



#### Metaphor

A comparison of two different things that DOES NOT use the words "like" or "as".


Example:

Noah has a heart of a lion.

#### What is a Simile?

Simile: A comparison using "like" or "as."

Simile Examples:

She was **as** smart as an owl.

The student was **QS** quiet as a mouse.

My backpack was *like a bag of bricks*.

Simile: Mike is like a teddy bear. Simile: Mike is as soft as a teddy bear.

Metaphor: Mike is a teddy bear.

Simile: That boy is like a pig.

Simile: That boy is as messy as a pig.

Metaphor: That boy is a pig.

## wHat is a metaPHOR?

Metaphor: A figure of speech stating two things are similar.

#### Metaphor Examples:

The <u>strawberry</u> was <u>a fresh summer day</u>.

The <u>rain</u> came down <u>in full cold buckets</u>.

The <u>test</u> was <u>a long never-ending marathon</u>.

She <u>read</u> the book <u>at a snail's pace</u>.



#### Personification


Personification: Giving human qualities to things and ideas.

Personhation Examples:
The tree leaves <u>danced in the wind</u>.
The chair <u>stood up straight and tall</u>.
The car jumped to the finish line.





## Alliteration

#### What is Alliteration?

Alliteration: Repeated consonant sounds at the beginning of words.

Betsy bought bigger bottoms for baby Billy.

s

Samantha saw seven silly soldiers selling strawberries Saturday.

Maria made millions of marshmallow muffins for many mellow messengers.

## Alliteration

A few words, one after the other, that begin with the same sound.

E.g. Bees buzzed brilliantly by the beautiful butterfly.

# Alliteration

The use of the same beginning consonant sound in a line or verse.

Example:

Peter Piper picked a peck of pickled peppers.






#### **ASSONANCE**

Repeating a vowel sound throughout a sentence phrase, paragraph, or entire piece of writing (A, E, I, O, U, sometimes Y).

#### Example

The Cat ran after the alligator who was trying to assist an alarmed drowning armadillo to get across the river.

### !!!Idioms!!!





#### **Examples of idioms: (study work)**

1) <u>A BLESSING IN DISGUISE</u>: A good thing that seemed bad at first.

Example: Running the 1200m even though you are unfit-but you won anyway.

2) <u>BETTER LATE THAN NEVER</u>: Better to arrive late than not to come at all.

Example: He arrived late at his own birthday party, luckily, he showed up otherwise the food would have gone to waste.

- 3) <u>BREAK A LEG:</u> Good luck Example: Usually used in theatre
- 4) <u>GO BACK TO THE DRAWING BOARD:</u> Starting something from the start.

Example: Losing a match or event and staring from the beginning on the strategic plans.

5) <u>IT'S NOT ROCKET SCIENCE</u>: It's not complicated Example: The math problem is not rocket science-you can solve it!

6) <u>THAT'S THE LAST STRAW:</u> My patience has run out.

Example: When you did everything and it still doesn't work-then your patience has run out.

- 7) <u>TIME FLIES WHEN YOU'RE HAVING FUN:</u> You don't notice how long something lasts when it's fun. Example: When we do art, time flies-because its always fun!
- 8) WE'LL CROSS THAT BRIDGE WHEN WE COME TO IT: Let's not talk about the problem right now. Example: When you leave something to the end because you cannot solve it yet.
- 9) <u>BREAK THE ICE:</u> Making people feel more comfortable.

Example: Staring an awkward conversation with a joke usually helps an uncomfortable situation.

10) <u>DON'T PUT ALL YOUR EGGS IN ONE</u>

<u>BASKET</u>: What you're doing is too risky.

Example: Don't spend all your allowance on one thing- you won't have any left for something special.
